# Tuples

- Tuples are easy: they are simply immutable lists.
- They are designated with a comma:
  - Not the parenthesis!

`myTuple = (1,'a',3.14,True)`

`newTuple = (,) #Empty tuple (mind the comma)`

`anotherTuple = 2,3 #Tuple without parenthesis`

# The Question is, Why?

- The real question is, why have an immutable list, a tuple, as a separate type?
  - An immutable list gives you a data structure with some integrity - that you cannot accidentally change.

# Lists and Tuples

- Everything that works with a list works with a tuple **except** methods that modify the list/tuple.
  - Thus indexing, slicing, len, print all work as expected.
  - However, none of the mutable methods work: append, extend, remove.
